

Message from the President



Dr. Abu Conteh, SLAA Community President

reetings to you, my Dear Readers:
As President of The Sierra Leone Association of Alberta (SLAA) from January, 2019 to August, 2024, and on behalf of my Executive Committee and the entire membership of said association, I present to you this first-ever SLAA Compendium. What you are now looking at is a document which is available in both print and electronic forms.

The idea is to provide a one-stop resource material. It was conceived and published as a concise report on the plans, programmes, and activities of SLAA. The focus is on the internal and external dynamics of this association for the purposes of clarity, transparency, and easy access. Hopefully, its contents

(text, photographs, and weblinks to articles and videos) would serve as reference materials for now and for posterity.

My two terms in office as Community President of SLAA have rolled by so quickly. I must express gratitude to God Almighty for granting us the opportunity to serve our community, and to community members for the confidence they had in voting me into office. I and the other Executive Committee Members whom I appointed took up responsibility on January 11, 2019, initially for a two-year term.

I campaigned and came into office on a 14-Point Plan. In one year, my Executive team, our dedicated volunteers, and I, were blessed to have accomplished more than

half of our plans. These include the first ever Census of the Sierra Leone Community in Alberta – which results are now being used to adequately plan for, and better serve our community. In addition to our Community WhatsApp Forum, my Executive Committee has developed our first-ever community website (https://sierraleonealberta.ca/) and community newsletter (SLAA Newsletter).

Our appreciation goes to the Government of Alberta for providing partial funding under the CIP Project-based Grant for the purchase of our first community-owned vehicle. With funding from the Government of Canada, under the New Horizons for Seniors Programs (NHSP), my executive is providing support to our seniors under our project entitled Promoting the Health of Seniors in the Sierra Leone Community. The Government of Canada provided us with a retrofitting grant under the Supporting Black Canadian Communities Initiative (SBCCI) Programme which enabled us to secure our Community Multi-Purpose Centre. This facility houses a main hall space, a secretariat, and a mezzanine for seminars/workshops. Our gratitude also goes to Santas Anonymous for providing us with Christmas gifts.

My executive has maintained the routine sociocultural and religious activities in our community. These include the Annual Flag-Raising Ceremony and celebration of Sierra Leone's Independence Anniversary, Annual Community Picnic, Edmonton Heritage Festival, Eid Celebrations and other Islamic events like community-wide Iftar (Breakfast) and Lai-la-tul Qadr (Night of Power), and Christmas celebrations including Nine Lessons and Carols, distribution of gifts, and feasting.

Furthermore, a few rounds of food hampers and gift cards were secured and distributed. Also, we

have held the Inaugural SLAA Presidential Awards Ceremony in 2024. A Government of Sierra Leone Consular Service exists here in Canada.

The other platform points are ongoing. These include networking with Sierra Leoneans in other provinces, linking new community members to available resources, delivering our Education Support Programmes (including after-school tutorials and The Brain of SLAA Quiz Contest), on our Values Project (including community panel discussions on topical issues), and reviving our Sponsorship Holder Agreement with the Government of Canada. We also maintain interactions with the various levels of government (municipal, provincial, and federal) and other agencies and community organizations like Sinkunia Community Development Organization, Edmonton Mennonite Centre for Newcomers. Edmonton Multicultural Coalition, Canada, Action for Healthy Communities, Africa Centre, Black Canadian Women In Action Society, and National Black Coalition of Canada. On behalf of the entire SLAA Membership, I would like to acknowledge and thank the Government of Canada for providing the funding for this project, through its SBCCI grant.

Your feedback is most welcome on this modest effort in communication by our beloved community association.

Background

Dr. Abu Conteh, President of The Sierra Leone Association of Alberta (SLAA), came into office on Friday 11 January, 2019. This followed his victory at a Community Presidential Election held in Edmonton, Alberta, on Saturday 27 October 2018. The objective of this poll was to elect a president who will then select individuals within our community that are credible and competent enough to serve as Board Members, otherwise referred to as Executives Members according to the association's bylaws. Dr. Conteh has since led the association, with the help of a team of executives and volunteers.

Every year, an Annual Report was presented by Dr. Conteh to community members at our Annual General Meetings (AGMs). This compendium is a compilation of the details contained in the successive Annual Reports. In essence, this SLAA Compendium is a report on the status of the association during the entire term of office of the Executive Committee headed by Dr. Abu Conteh as Community President.

At each of his Annual Reports, presented at AGMs of this association, Community President Dr. Abu Conteh updates the membership on the state of the association. These reports are typically complemented by Financial Reports. The SLAA Executive Committee also invites presentations from various committees set up to implement SLAA programmes, projects, and related activities.

Dr. Conteh would recall the 14 different categories of programs or plans on which he ran for the presidency of SLAA in October 2018. He would also acknowledge members of his executive committee, the corps of dedicated SLAA volunteers, and other stakeholders as key players in the implementation of these plans and programmes during his tenure as Community President.

Taking one plan/project at a time, and with the aid of projected slides, the president would brief SLAA Members on its rationale, status or progress made so far, and the prospects in its implementation.

1. census

- A census of members of SLAA is a first step in planning effectively and implementing all the other plans efficiently. SLAA carried out its first ever census of members in 2019.
- The exercise obtained key demographic characteristics of each adult member and his/her family/ household members. Details like age range, gender, educational background, employment status and occupation were sought.
- Also, respondents were asked about their emotional or psychological feelings, and their perceptions of SLAA as their community organization.
- This project was funded jointly by SLAA and The Sinkunia Community Development Organization, a non-profit which is also based in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada.
- At the 2019 SLAA AGM, the president proudly announced that this project is now complete. The results were analyzed by Mr. Alimamy Mansaray, who is also an SLAA member.
- The president acknowledged Mr. Mansaray (present at the AGM) for his voluntary services in analyzing the findings. Mr. Mansaray later made a formal presentation of his analysis to the meeting.
- This census has helped us in our community needs assessments which in turn have been invaluable in our various applications for grants (municipal, provincial, federal).
- Among highlights of the census findings was that there were slightly more women than men in the SLAA population (54% versus 46%).




Figure 1-2: SLAA Census Results - 2019

2. Hall Aquisition

- The acquisition of a community hall has been long overdue and cannot be overemphasized.
- Among its many benefits, the association will save money in the long run, if SLAA has its own hall and stops paying rental fees each time we have a meeting or some other functions for which SLAA requires the use of a hall.
- While preparing for the acquisition of a hall, the current executive committee secured an office space at the Clareview Multicultural Centre in 2019. It was the

first-ever secretariat of the association.

- With funding from the Government of Canada, we were able to secure a facility that now serves as our multi-purpose community centre.
- The place serves as an administrative hub and a base for our socio-cultural and religious activities.




Figure 2-16: The centre in use for a dinner (Looking toward the back)




Figure 2-19: The centre in use for an award ceremony

3. Consular

- Even though we have thousands of Sierra Leoneans living in Canada, there is only one embassy in the USA that is serving Sierra Leoneans living in both countries. Sierra Leoneans living in Alberta have only this embassy, in Washington DC., to access consular and other diplomatic services.
- Among the many benefits of having the country's consular services closer to us in Edmonton and other parts of Alberta, which is the primary purpose of this SLAA project, is the ease in obtaining or renewing passports with the Government of Sierra Leone.
- The SLAA President and his executive team are currently advocating for consular services in this part of Canada. In his report, delivered at the association's 2019 AGM, Dr. Conteh noted that a consular service does not necessarily require an office, for the consular official to carry out his/her duties. He added that an Alberta-based Sierra Leone Consul can even have another job or operate his/her own business, while running the consular affairs of the Government of Sierra Leone.
- We have also reached out for recognition by the Embassy which has now been received (See YouTube video below).
- A consular service exists in Ottawa, Canada, headed by Hon. David Pratt.

4. Social, Cultural, and Religious Projects

- SLAA typically undertakes various activities to facilitate and promote social interactions, cultural heritage, religious education, and the observance of Christian and Islamic Ceremonies. This is in addition to the traditional celebration of Sierra Leone's Independence Anniversary and other civic engagements. This trait inspired the concept of Platform Point # 4 by the current executive team.
- This Platform Point is, by its very title, a composite venture. It means it comprises various sub-projects and similar initiatives. Some of the activities it covers are seasonal and often recurring. Others, like births, marriages, bereavement, and invitations of SLAA by other organizations, may be undertaken as the need arises.
- Some events would fall in more than one category. For example, a quiz competition for school children could also be classified as an event to promote the involvement of children in community activities.
- The SLAA President said that SLAA Family Members have been calling for the association's increased and proactive involvement in the promotion of traditional events which benefit children more directly.
- Thus, an overview of this Platform Point would highlight (but not limited to) the following:

1. Religious – Christian & Islamic: Ramadan, Lent, Eid (Islamic festivals)

Religion, specifically Christianity and Islam, are deeply woven into the social fabric of Sierra Leone. Indeed, most social events start or end with a prayer. In many instances, there is a cleric to grace the occasion and convey Allah/God's blessings upon the gathering and the person/family at the centre of the occasion. The majority of Sierra Leoneans profess faith in God (Christians) or Allah (Muslims) and many are devoted practitioners of either faith. This means, most Sierra Leoneans engage in Christian and/or Islamic practices at some point in their lives.

These religious traits are vividly evident among the membership of SLAA.

Since taking office in 2019 and up to date, Dr. Abu Conteh as SLAA Community President would typically make a public statement in the days leading to a religious event like Christmas, Eid-UI Fitri, Eid-UI-Adha, Easter, and the start/end of related seasons like Advent, Lent, and Ramadan.




Figure 4-1-6: Presidential Lent Message, 2024




Figure 4-6-7: Tug-of-War – Children – Boys vs Girls at the 2023 SLAA Annual Community Picnic in Edmonton, AB

9. Conflict Resolution within the Sierra Leone Community

SLAA has a Peace and Conflict Resolution Committee to help members settle their differences in an amicable manner and with mutual respect.

10. Bereavement

Deaths are an unwelcome fact of life. To this end, our executive team supports bereaved individuals and families as best as possible. Some of the ways the SLAA supports grieving members and their families are the use of the community's social media platforms and the collection of financial contributions.

Specifically, SLAA facilitates the dissemination of key details about the loss of a loved one, their obituary, and tentative/confirmed funeral arrangements, on the SLAA WhatsApp forum.

While the executive makes itself available to anchor such mass communication, members of the bereaved family are able to take the lead if they prefer to do so.

Also, SLAA coordinates the collection of donations made by sympathizers (within and outside the association) to the bereaved family of a registered member. In times of bereavement, it is up to the affected family to decide to what extent SLAA would be involved.

SLAA has a funeral policy to help the bereaved family when a registered member passes away. The policy came into effect in 2019 with the approval of the general membership.

- This project is meant to help SLAA members facilitate the migration of their loved ones to Canada, especially those who have skills that are in high demand in the job market in Alberta and other parts of this country.
- The aim of this project is to guide potential immigrants on appropriate programmes such as the Skilled Worker Program, Sponsorship Holder Agreement, Group of Five, Super Visa for Parents and Grandparents, Family Class Reunion, and Study Permit.
- SLAA does this by providing prospective applicants with useful tips and firsthand background information about industries, sectors, and current workforce demographics.
- SLAA is working to revive the Sponsorship Holder Agreement.




Figure 5-1: A slide from an SLAA presentation prepared for this Platform Point project

6. Networking with Sierra Leoneans in other provinces

- The rationale of this project is to help Sierra Leone community organizations optimize desired outcomes by cooperating with each other in tackling challenges which compatriots may face no matter where they live in Canada.
- One example was how the collaboration of various Sierra Leone community organizations attracted attention and support from the Canadian Parliament during the Ebola outbreak in Sierra Leone and other West African countries around 2014. Before this concerted effort, no single organization was able to attract such attention and support.
- Networking with counterpart associations in other provinces of Canada will serve SLAA Members well. For one thing, cooperation and collaboration of

- Sierra Leonean community organizations will facilitate travel; whether for work, education, tourism, or internal migration.
- To address this platform point, SLAA is part of a social media (WhatsApp) forum comprising leaders of various Sierra Leone community organizations in some of the provinces in Canada.
 Through this platform, the leaders effectively collaborate, share resources, and help one another in their respective communities.
- In addition, we collaborate via email, telephone, and video conference and attend programmes/events organized by sister Sierra Leonean community organizations.

7. Linking New Sierra Leoneans to available resources

- SLAA has an official website (www. sierraleonealberta.ca), a Facebook page (SLAA: Sierra Leone Association of Alberta), and a WhatsApp platform where members of the association interact and receive updates on current developments within the community, and in other parts of Canada.
- The executive committee also disseminates public notices and advisories from the various levels of government (municipal, provincial, and federal) and other agencies and organizations.
- The Executive Team supplements official publications with video translations of the messages, in Sierra Leone's lingua franca which is Krio.
- The association not only conveys public

- notices and referrals (formal/informal), but also explains their details on its social media platform. Members are assured that they can call upon executive members and volunteers for any assistance they may need in accessing resources which are available as advertised.
- The Coronavirus pandemic and its attendant restrictions was a big test in assessing the unity and social cohesion among members of the Sierra Leone community in our part of Canada. SLAA was in the middle of this trying time as the executive committee sought to promote connections and interactions among members even when social distancing, isolation, and quarantining were the predominant trends.

- We have mentor-mentee relationships; hence getting our community members to serve as role models for youngsters.




Figure 9-1: Sierra Leone Association of Alberta: First Community Panel Discussion on Topical Issues - June 19, 2022




Figure 10-2: Certificate of Recognition - Edmonton Leone Stars


Figure 12-3: SLAA Mentorship Program – Distribution of Computers to Students

13. Support for Seniors

SLAA believes that caring for our seniors is a traditional responsibility of the family and community in a typical African home setting. Customarily, we prefer not to send our seniors to assisted living/long-term care facilities.

To this end, SLAA has a Coordinating Team for Seniors that works with community volunteers in rendering the following services:

• Help seniors or their family members identify, access, and use available support services.

- Deliver packages that contain culturallyappropriate grocery and hygiene/sanitary items.




Figure 13-1: Cover of Greeting Card presented to SLAA seniors during food hamper delivery in 2020



14. Vehicle Acquisition

- Transportation is a key component in the effective delivery of services to our members and facilitating their participation in community activities.
- Until 2022, our association faced constraints in this regard because SLAA, as an entity, did not have its own means of transportation. Vehicle owners/drivers within the association used to help the community meet its transportation needs as best as they could, but these individual courtesies were clearly not enough for the optimal operations of SLAA.
- The kind gestures of motorists within our community were and are still appreciated by the wider SLAA membership. Yet, the trend only underscored a dire need for SLAA to acquire its own vehicle, preferably a multi-seater van with ample cargo space.
- The need for an SLAA vehicle was most pronounced when the association needed to mobilize elderly members (seniors), families with young children, volunteers, and people with mobility challenges.

Internally, we acknowledge the immeasurable contributions of the various social entities within our community. Over the years, SLAA worked well with these groups (as listed earlier) as they helped us tap into our diverse socio-cultural characteristics for the collective good of the community.

For example, some of our constituent groups proudly represented Sierra Leonean culture at public events like the Edmonton Heritage Festival and Diversity Magazine's AfroFest Carnival.

In this same spirit, we acknowledge the contributions of some members like Mohamed Jalloh (Wanduni) for his musical performances; Annette Jalloh's Medanne Productions and Patricia Sesay's Dimdin Podcasts; and Artist Gibril Bangura, for making similar contributions at every opportunity.

SLAA's plans, projects, and programmes during the tenure of office of Dr. Abu Conteh have either been completed or, by their nature, ongoing. We call for the active participation of members, in both financial and human resource terms.

SLAA encourages, even urges, eligible persons to formally register with the association; pay monthly subscriptions in full and on time; and continue to play active roles to the best of their abilities. Formal registration comprises paying a one-time registration fee and then providing key personal and household information to the SLAA Census Committee.

Each person has a responsibility to the rest of the community. In return, the rest of the community –

through SLAA – is responsible to each individual member. Among the key duties of each member is the meeting of all financial commitments, as best as one's personal resources allow. Conversely, SLAA has a duty to pool the resources generated from membership contributions and organizational fundraising and utilize these funds responsibly.

We received a total of Two Thousand, Eight Hundred and Thirty Five Dollars (\$857 from the Sierra Leone Canada Friendship Association's Account and \$1978 from The Sierra Leone Association of Alberta's Account) from our predecessor when we took office. We raised more than One Million Dollars (\$1,025,672.56) in grants money. We also raised a few thousand dollars from membership registration, monthly dues, and bereavement contributions. We are leaving office with more than Fifty Thousand Dollars in our accounts. These monies are assigned to community programmes and must be used for the intended purposes. We thank our members for their respective contributions as we look forward to getting more members to contribute their time, energy, skills, and/or experience as volunteers.
